

PE Sports Grant Information 2015-16

Funding for Primary School PE and Sports

St George's Primary School received a grant from the Government for £8,315 for the year 2015-16. The aim of this funding is to improve the Physical Education (PE) offered by primary schools, and is provided jointly by various governmental departments, including Education, Health and Culture, and Media and Sport.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, though how they do this remains their decision.

This is how St George's Primary School uses the funding:

- hiring a specialist PE provision In2Sport to deliver teacher CPD throughout the school. Teachers will gain knowledge in specialist teaching of gymnastics, dance and outdoor games.
- to have specialist In2Sport coaches working every lunchtime alongside children and MDSAs to create confident pupil sports leaders and provide MDSA CPD.
- releasing teachers from class duties to attend sporting festivals with children such as dance and rugby events.
- provide high quality PE equipment in school for curriculum and playtimes.
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs
- subsidising transport costs to enable children to attend sporting events

How St George's will raise the profile of PE using the Sports Grant

The greatest investment for this year has been the provision of specialist coaches from in2Sport to work along side staff and children. This will have a lasting impact on the quality of Physical Education the children receive, not just in classes taken but via the ongoing abilities of staff throughout the whole school. In2Sport provide detailed feedback for staff they work with including further areas for development.
