



### Sports Premium Funding Statement 2017-2018

The planned use of the sports' funding at St George's C .of E Primary School is being used **to promote increased health and physical activity** across the school. The school works on the belief that if children are more healthy and active, then they are fitter and more alert. **Healthy, active, fitter and more alert children will have higher attendance and will have greater engagement in lessons resulting in higher achievement.** We also believe that children who enjoy and achieve success in P.E. at Primary School will **continue to participate in sport and progress at Secondary School and into adulthood** and therefore **the benefits will be longer lasting.**

#### Funding allocation for 2017-2018 = £16,670

Actions and funding allocation	Rationale - How will this promote increased health / physical activity?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Classroom touch-screens and interactive P.E resource 5-a-day £10,140</li> </ul>	Children will have daily access to a varied, indoor exercise routine displayed on clear screen to maximise involvement. As well as providing extra daily exercise, this can also be used for wet playtimes when children would otherwise miss out on physical activity.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sports' leader training and non/contact time £3,599</li> </ul>	Release time to all allow the P.E. subject leader to attend training and lead the subject effectively monitor and identify areas for improvement, in the school's P.E. provision.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Specialist Sports' Coaching £1,596</li> </ul>	Children to receive specialist sports' coaching which will increase their physical skill in various sports leading to increased enjoyment and in-turn, increased participation in the future.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Playtime trolley and equipment £410</li> </ul>	Varied equipment at break-times will provide greater opportunities to practice a variety of individual and group skills that will support progress in their P.E. lessons and encourage greater participation in physical activity through quality resources.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Early years' equipment – trikes, scooters &amp; all-weather suits £400</li> </ul>	New, high quality / robust Trikes / scooters will promote gross motor skills as part of the early years' curriculum and provide more opportunities for children to choose physical activities as part of their child initiated play. All weather suits will enable children to access outside physical activities more often.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Year 4 swimming £350</li> </ul>	Funding for the year 4 children as a small cohort (8) to attend swimming for a term means that they can have highly tailored focussed swimming sessions increasing stamina and skill and enable them to meet the 25m standard expected of a KS2 child.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>West Wilts Sports Alliance Subscription £175</li> </ul>	Paying into the Sports' Alliance will provide greater competitive sporting opportunities (providing focus for P.E. lessons) and CPD for teachers improve the quality of their provision.

Actions and funding allocation	Impact - How did this promote increased health / physical activity?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Specialist teaching £4330</li> </ul>	<p>Children had access to a higher level of provision than would necessarily be provided from just having P.E. sessions from the class teacher. Therefore the children experienced a wider range of sports and developed greater skills.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Lunchtime play leader £2165</li> </ul>	<p>Observation of the provision at lunch time showed a variety of children engaged activities that promoted high quality games' skills</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Repairs to Trim Trail £1,210</li> </ul>	<p>This enabled children to have full access to the resource that encourages balance and gross motor skills</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Coach for Wiltshire dance festival £100</li> </ul>	<p>This not only developed some children's skills in dance composition and performance but gave experience of competition</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>West Wiltshire Sports Alliance – annual subscription £150</li> </ul>	<p>Children took part in a wide variety of competitive sport which the school could not have accessed within just the local MAT</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>PE Equipment (goals etc.) £250</li> </ul>	<p>Children across all ages have used the new equipment to play formal and less formal games thus promoting gross motor skills and increased activity levels compared to the level and type of activity that was observed without such equipment.</p>
